

Winter Storm Today - Tonight

Highest Confidence for Impacts North of Interstate 80

Key Messages

- A winter storm will impact eastern lowa and northern Illinois today & tonight
- A mix of rain, sleet & snow is expected south of an Ottumwa to Galesburg line, with snow elsewhere
- Warm ground temps, and air temps generally at or above freezing for much of the event, will play a critical role in determining snow amounts
- Highest accums expected on grassy & elevated surfaces
- Later this afternoon & evening will be period of main travel concerns – highest confidence for impacts north of I-80



Winter Storm Today - Tonight



Hazards

Moderate to heavy wet snow of 3-7 inches in the warning area. Lesser amounts to the south.



<u>Timing</u>


Mid morning through tonight, including the evening commute.



Impacts

- Visibility restrictions due to heavy snowfall rates and wet snow
- Snow will initially melt due to the warm ground and above freezing temps. But, periods of moderate to heavy snowfall rates are expected to lead to slushy and slick roads - mainly later this afternoon & tonight. Highest accums will be on grassy & elevated surfaces

Uncertainty & Considerations Lower confidence exist with snow amounts due to initial snowmelt from warm ground and temperatures above freezing for much of the event




Snowfall Forecast Today through Friday Morning




Likelihood of Various Snow Amounts

Probability for 2+" of snow







Estimated Precipitation Timing

Details

- → Snow will move in from mid morning to mid afternoon
- → Mixed precipitation with rain and sleet is likely south of an Ottumwa to Galesburg line, reducing snow totals
- → Peak hourly snowfall rates (½ inch to around 1 inch per hour) expected to develop S/W to N/E 12 PM to 9 PM



Shoveling heavy, wet snow can put a big strain on the heart

Stay hydrated and take frequent breaks

Only move small amounts with each shovel pass







Snow-Covered Roads = Take it Slow!

BEFORE YOU GO

Check road conditions.

Call 511 or visit your state's DOT webpage to check on road conditions. Choose a different route or adjust your travel plans if road conditions are poor.

Pack an emergency supply kit.

Stock your vehicle with a mobile phone, charger, batteries, blankets, flashlight, first-aid kit, high-calorie, non-perishable food, candle to melt snow for drinking water, sack of sand or cat litter for traction, shovel, scraper, and battery booster cables.



Change your travel plans if hazardous weather is expected.

Ready your vehicle.

Check your battery, wipers, coolant, and other systems affected by cold temperature. Make sure your tires have good tread. Clear snow, ice or dirt from your windows, lights and camera.
