Widespread soaking rains and a few severe storms possible!

Key Messages

- Thunderstorms tonight (80-100%).
- Marginal risk (level 1 of 5) for severe storms with large hail the primary threat.
- An upgrade to a Slight risk (level 2 of 5) is possible for portions of the area.
- Widespread soaking rains of 0.5 to 1.5" (lower totals north of Hwy 30).

- First issuance

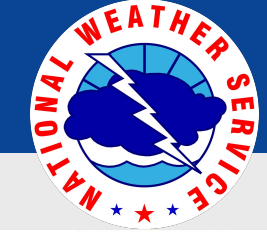
Next Scheduled Update

Marginal Risk (Level 1 of 5)

Key Messages

- Marginal Risk (level 1 of 5) for severe storms tonight.
 - ◆ Isolated to scattered severe storms.
 - ◆ An upgrade to a Slight Risk (level 2 of 5) is possible.
- Severe Timing: **7 PM - 12 AM**

Primary Hazards

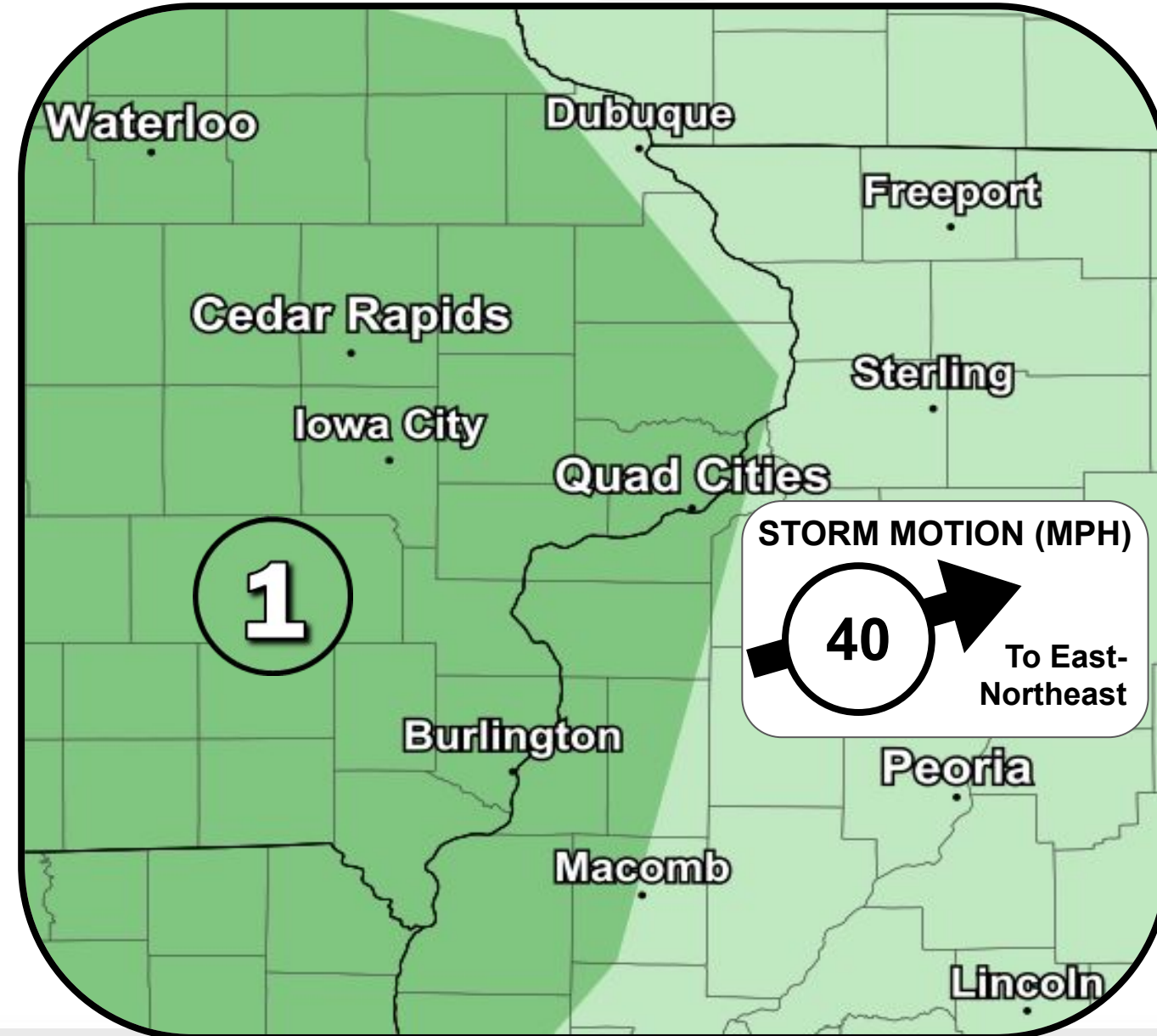
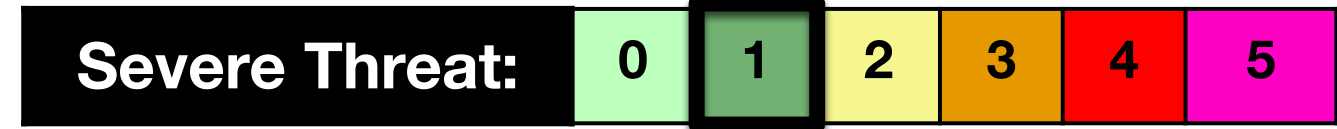
- Large hail up to 1.5" in diameter (ping-pong ball)
- Torrential downpours
- Lightning

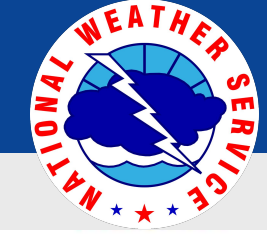
Secondary Hazard (lower threat)

- Gusty winds

Actions

- Have a way to be alerted while you are asleep!
- When thunder roars, go indoors!





Heavy Rain Potential Tonight

October 24, 2024

Beneficial widespread rainfall

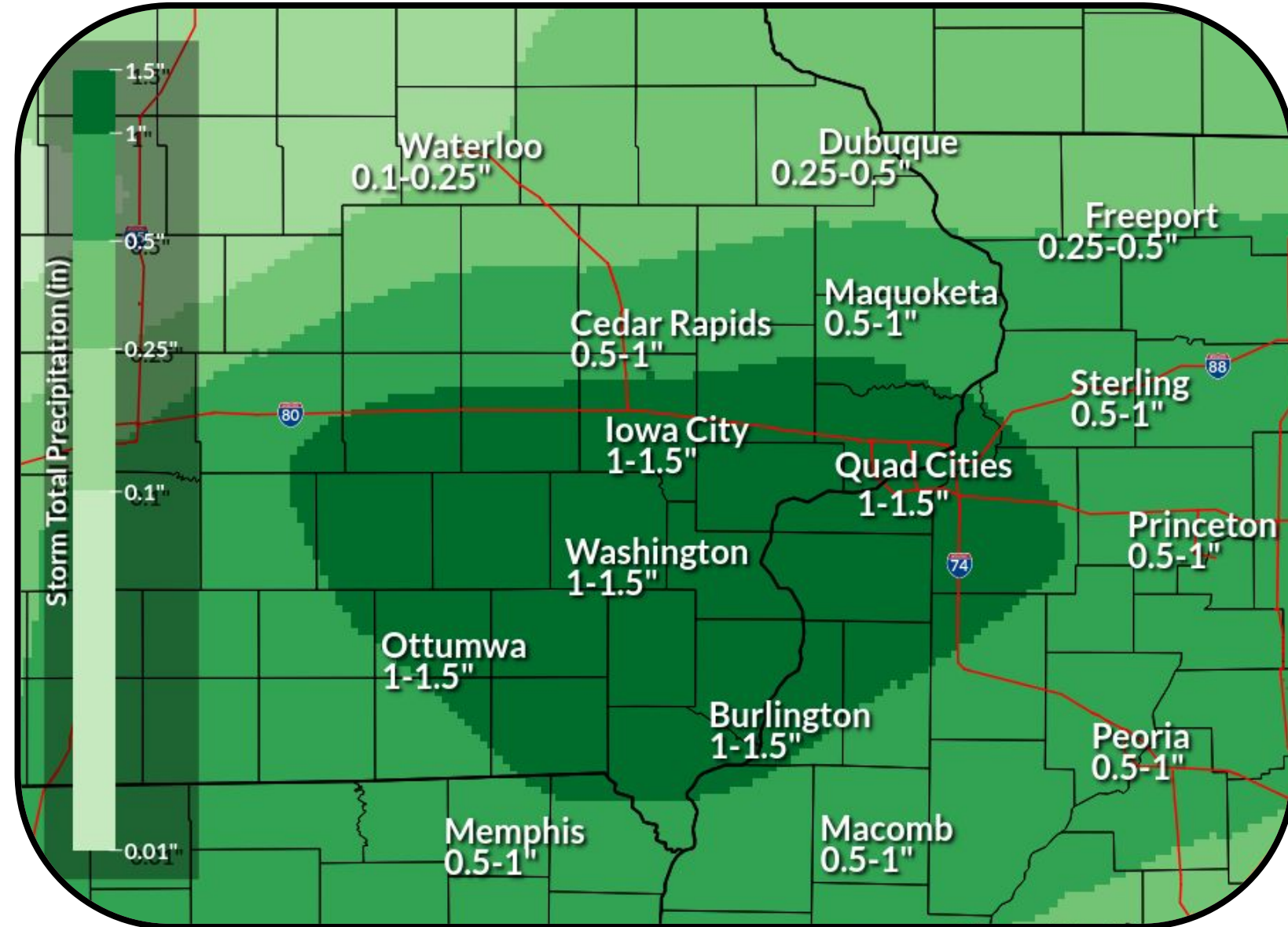
Key Messages

- Widespread soaking rainfall is expected.
 - ◆ Rainfall of 0.5 to 1.5", with locally higher amounts possible.
 - ◆ Lower totals north of Hwy 30.
- Dry soils should soak up the rain efficiently.
- However, passing heavy downpours and high rainfall rates could lead to brief periods of ponding water on roadways and parking lots, and also reduced visibility.

Actions

- Slow down if driving during heavy rain!
- Monitor the latest forecast for updates.

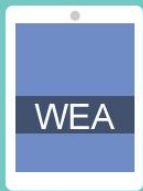

Caught in a Hail Storm While Driving?

- Pull off the road if possible and point your vehicle into the wind. The windshield is the strongest window.
- DO NOT park under overpasses! This can block the flow of traffic, including for emergency vehicles!
- Cover yourself in case the windows shatter and debris enters the vehicle (a jacket or floor mat).
