Key Messages

- Chance (20-30%) of freezing drizzle this evening, mainly N of I-80 in far E Iowa and NW Illinois. Should it occur, slippery travel would be possible.
- Accumulating dry, fluffy snow Saturday night into Sunday morning. Several inches of accumulation and travel impacts are likely, especially N of Hwy 34.
- Colder Sunday night with wind chills dropping between zero to -15F.

- This evening (6pm - midnight)

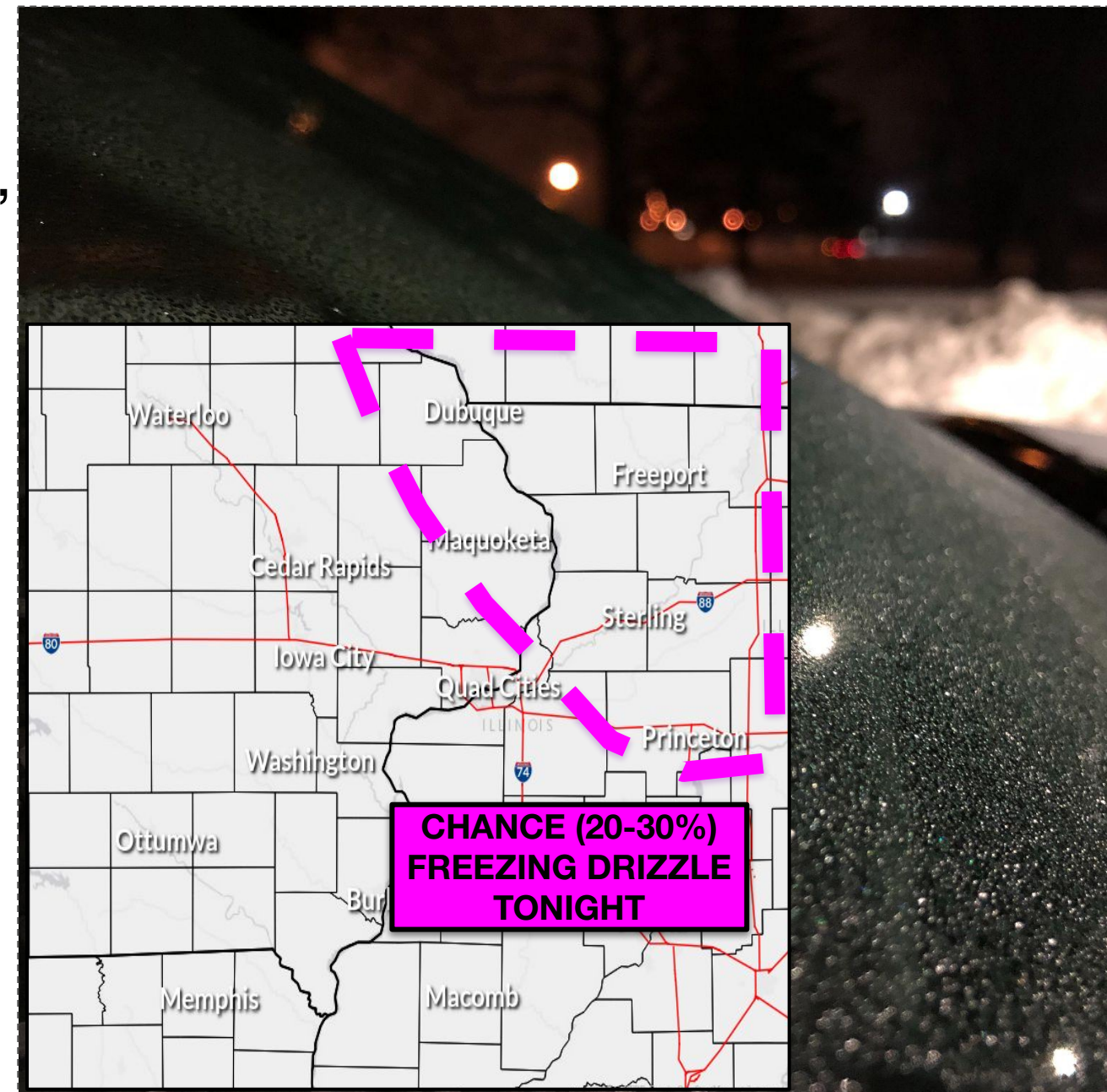

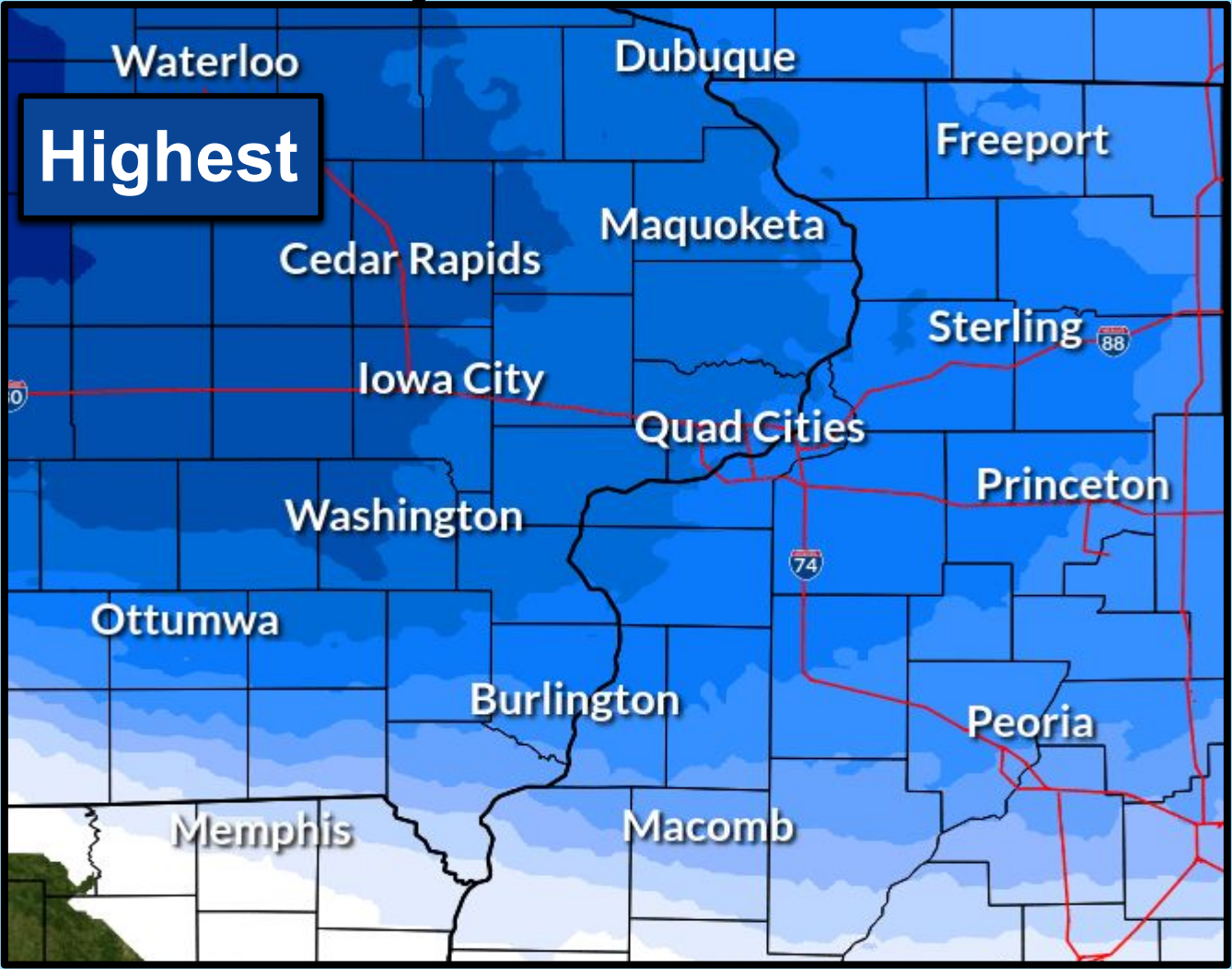

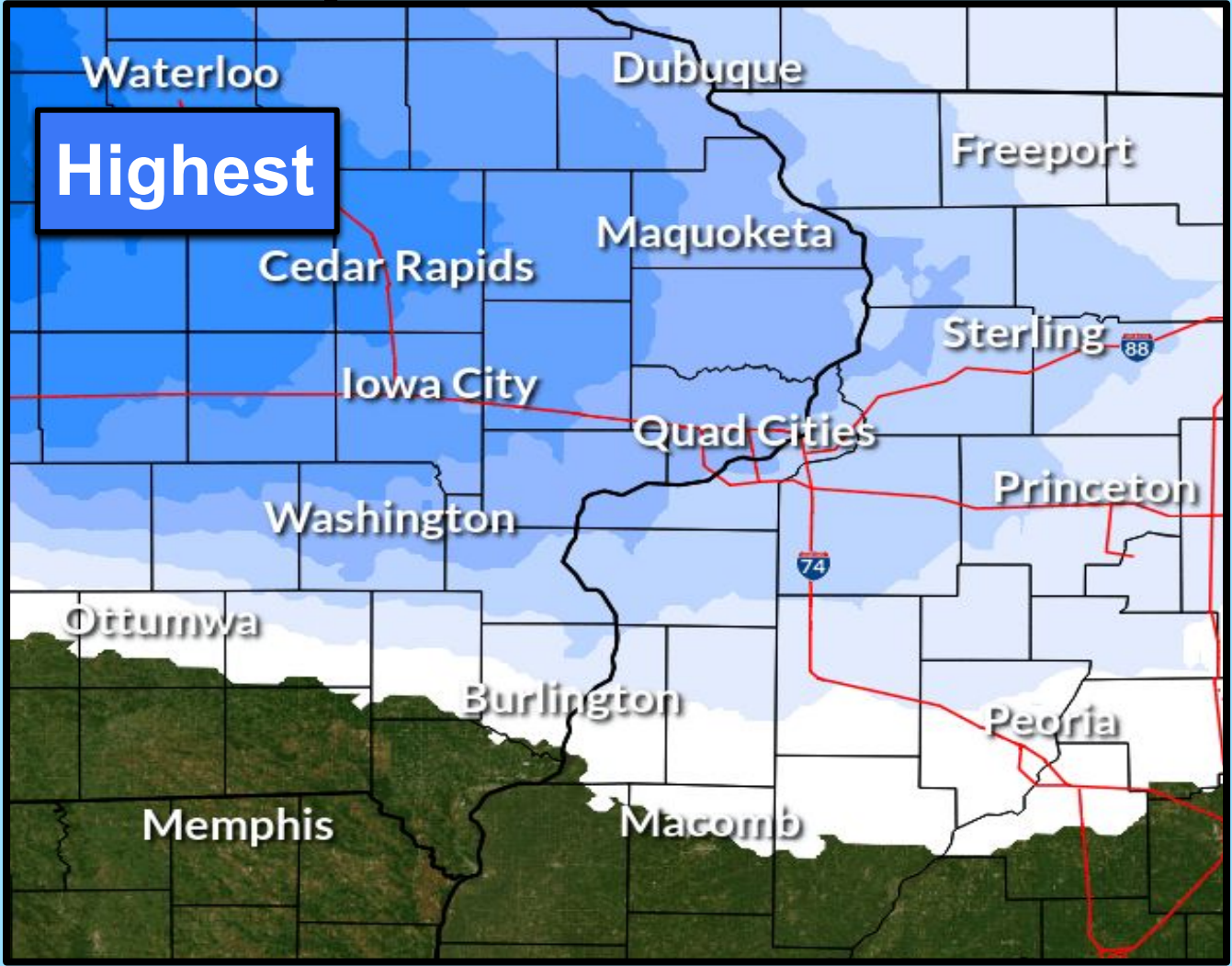


Accumulating Dry/Fluffy Snow Saturday Night - Early Sunday

Probability of Greater Than 4 Inches

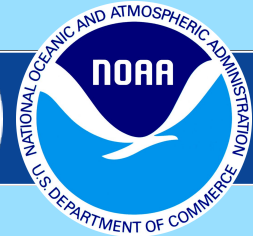


TIMING

- Ending (west to east) 4 AM to 10 AM SUN

POTENTIAL HAZARDS
